- 1) Supply the second and third principal part of the verb to be used.
- 2) Supply the correct form of the future or aorist (indicative, active) for each sentence.
(Augment the aorist!)
- 2) To the right of each sentence, change the verb to singular, if it is plural (same person), and to plural, if it is singular.

I *lead, drive, conduct, carry, take*

1) ἄγω (pres.) 2) ἄξω (fut.) 3) ἤγαγον (aor.)

- a) We led ἤγάγομεν the sacrifice to the altar. (ἤγαγον)
- b) We will lead ἄξομεν the sacrifice to the altar. ἄξω
- c) He led ἤγαγε the sacrifice to Chrysa. ἤγαγον
- d) The Achaeans led ἤγαγον the sacrifice to Chrysa. ἤγαγε
- e) They will lead ἄξουσι the sacrifice to Chrysa. ἄξει
- f) You (pl) led ἤγάγετε the sacrifice to Chrysa. ἤγαγες
- g) You (sg) will lead ἄξεις the sacrifice to Chrysa. ἄξετε

II *love, cherish, entertain*

1) φιλέω (pres.) 2) φιλήσω (fut.) 3) ἐφίλησα (aor.)

- a) Hera loved ἐφίλησε the Achaeans. ἐφίλησαν
- b) The gods loved ἐφίλησαν the Achaeans. ἐφίλησε
- c) They will cherish φιλήσουσι the king of Troy. φιλήσει
- d) You (sg) ἐφίλησας entertained the king of Troy. ἐφιλήσατε
- e) We entertained ἐφιλήσαμεν the king of Troy. ἐφίλησα

III rule (over) (i.e., be king of, protect (i.e., be protector of)

1) ἀνάσσω (pres.) 2) ἀνάξω (fut.) 3) ἥναξα (aor.)

- a) Apollo ruled ἥναξε sacred Tenedos. ἥναξαν
- b) The sons of Atreus ruled ἥναξαν Mycenae. ἥναξε
- c) The Trojans ruled ἥναξαν all the cities. ἥναξε
- d) We will rule ἀνάξομεν Troy. ἀνάξω
- e) You (sg) ἀνάξεις will rule Troy. ἀνάξετε

IV send, escort,

1) πέμπω (pres.) 2) πέμψω (fut.) 3) ἔπεμψα (aor.)

***Figure out the fut. and aorist from the clue at the bottom of p. 47, or use the review vocabulary in section 57 (or the vocabulary list at the back of the book).**

- a) I sent ἔπεμψα a gift to Priam. ἐπέμψαμεν
- b) Did you (pl) send ἐπέμψατε a gift to Priam? ἔπεμψας
- c) You (sg) will send πέμψεις a gift to Priam. πέμψετε
- d) He sent ἔπεμψε a gift to Priam. ἔπεμψαν
- e) She will send πέμψει a gift to Priam. πέμψουσι
- f) We sent ἐπέμψαμεν a gift to Priam. ἔπεμψα
