(φεύγω, φεύξομαι, ἔφυγον)
Let's flee. (subj)
They <u>could flee</u> . (κέν + opt.)
<u>Don't flee</u> ! (μή with aor. subj.)
Flee! (pl. imperative)
(πλάζω, πλάγξομαι, ἔπλαγξα)
May the gods beat back the Achaeans. (opt)
Trojans, beat back the Achaeans from the gates! (imperative)
If you (sg.) were to beat back the Achaeans [opt. since I'm not entirely confident], Troy would
survive
We <u>might beat back</u> the Achaeans. (potential κέν + opt.)
(λύω, λύσω, ἔλυσα)
Ransom (sg.) the priest's daughter!
Free (pl.) the priest's daughter!
<u>Let's ransom</u> the priest's daughter
May the gods <u>free</u> the priest's daughter. (opt.)
Let him ransom the priest's daughter. (subj.)
