4.1 Write out each of the words below and dividing them into syllables. As you write them, pronounce them syllable-by-syllable (each should contain a vowel or diphthong sound). Then write them again (as one word) and pronounce them.

* Note: When α consonant is followed by μ , ν , λ , or ρ , they combine so smoothly that the two are often considered a single sound and will begin a syllable (e.g., $\tau\rho$). So, too, the combination $\mu\nu$ is sometimes treated as $-\mu\nu$, while σ and τ slide together to create $\sigma\tau$.
