- \* Note: When  $\alpha$  consonant is followed by  $\mu$ ,  $\nu$ ,  $\lambda$ , or  $\rho$ , they combine so smoothly that the two are often considered a single sound and will begin a syllable (e.g.,  $\tau\rho$ ). So, too, the combination  $\mu\nu$  is sometimes treated as  $-\mu\nu$ , while  $\sigma$  and  $\tau$  slide together to create  $\sigma\tau$ .
